## **New Clinic Volunteer Training**

**Wildlife Rescue Clinic volunteers are the backbone of our organization.  
We could not care for the 2500+ wild animals we receive each year without  
our incredible Clinic volunteers.**

Clinic volunteers perform a variety of jobs at the Clinic, including

- feeding baby birds, preparing foods for each species
- helping us maintain a scientific database
- speaking with the public
- transporting wild animals to rehabilitators
- cleaning animal enclosures
- releasing birds into the wild
- and much more

Volunteers must be at least age 13. Ages 11 and 12 may volunteer with a parent.

All Clinic volunteers must pass the Clinic Volunteer test before working with animals at the Clinic.

If you have ever considered becoming a wildlife rehabilitator, this is the first step.
